**Book 1: Required Novel** – *Out of My Mind* by Sharon M. Draper **Assignment:** Note-Taking Graphic Organizer // **Due August 28** (Monday)

To take notes on your novel, you may use either the graphic organizer found on the next two pages <u>or</u> create your own graphic organizer that includes the same information. This will help you review the novel before returning to school to better prepare for your classwork. Students should expect a quiz and writing assignment upon their return to school. **Please bring this book with you during the first week of school.** 

#### **Book 2: Choice Novel**

Please read a book of your choosing. Your choice of a novel should be appropriate for **your age and reading level.** *Please find more detailed instructions along with a rubric for this assignment on the last page of this packet.*

# **CREATIVE COLLAGE - STUDENT CHOICE NOVEL**

The **purpose** of this assignment is to create a collage utilizing visual images to represent various elements from your choice novel. If you like to draw, feel free to draw images for the collage and show off your artistic skills. If you aren't much of an artist but are still creative, use magazines, newspapers, or printed-out photos. Be as creative as you like! *Please find below the rubric that will be used to assess your project*.

- *1.* Your collage must **fill** one 8.5"x 11" piece of paper as a *minimum* size. Your collage can be as large as a 22" x 28" poster board.
- 2. Your collage must include the **title**, **author**, and novel **genre**.
- 3. Your collage must include a **plot diagram**.
- *4.* Your collage must include a **short summary** of the novel highlighting its major plot points.
- *5.* Your collage should include *at least* **TWO** major **themes** along with important **quotes** that support that theme.
- *6.* Your collage must include the names of the major **characters** and important settings.
- *7.* Your collage must have *at least* **FIVE** images.
- *8.* Be ready to present your collage when you bring it to school on <u>*August 17th.*</u>
